**Allegheny Energy Awards \$30,000 TechConnect Grant to Moundsville Junior High School**  
*Contribution to Purchase Computer Equipment for Classroom Instruction*

**Hagerstown, Md., October 23, 2001** – As part of its proud and enthusiastic commitment to communities, schools, and students, Allegheny Energy, Inc. More than 200 schools submitted grant proposals, which were evaluated by teams of educators and business leaders.

Wood, Principal, Moundsville Junior High School. “Our grant writers, Alice Cook, Margie Bungard, and Bill Burrall, continuously work to enhance our technology facility. The TechConnect grant will allow us to institute a wireless laptop computer lab that will provide the flexibility needed to reach every math and science student. Currently, our students are exploring the simulation of energy sources, based on the environment of the simulated planet.”
